President's Message

Dear Members of the Archbishop Riordan High School Family,

I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on the rich history of Archbishop Riordan High School over the past seven decades, while looking forward with great excitement to the upcoming growth and change for our beloved school.

The authenticity of the Riordan family really hit home for me in August when 17 members of the Class of 1955 attended an all-school assembly to receive their Diamond Diplomas, celebrating 60 years as alumni. Eight members of the original graduating class of 1950—they spent their senior year in the newly built Archbishop Riordan High School—were also in attendance and received a plaque honoring their pioneering spirit. The boys cheered and applauded enthusiastically for each recipient, and the members of these two classes responded with equal fervor. I was deeply touched by this genuine display of mutual affection for each other and for Riordan.

Some good news is that for the first time in over 10 years our enrollment is up to 700 students, reflecting the diversity of our great city. In terms of capital improvements, our school painting project will begin in December. The seismic study of our building required by a recent City of San Francisco ordinance is complete and I am happy to report that our buildings are compliant. Phase I of the gym restoration project has been completed, and our marching band (the largest in the city) has been asked to perform at the Super Bowl and other major events in February.

Most importantly, though, is that our students are learning, volunteering, and thriving in the true Marianist spirit of brotherhood, including our international boarding program students who are integrating well into Riordan student life (see page 16).

Renderings of the new paint color scheme for Riordan's exterior.





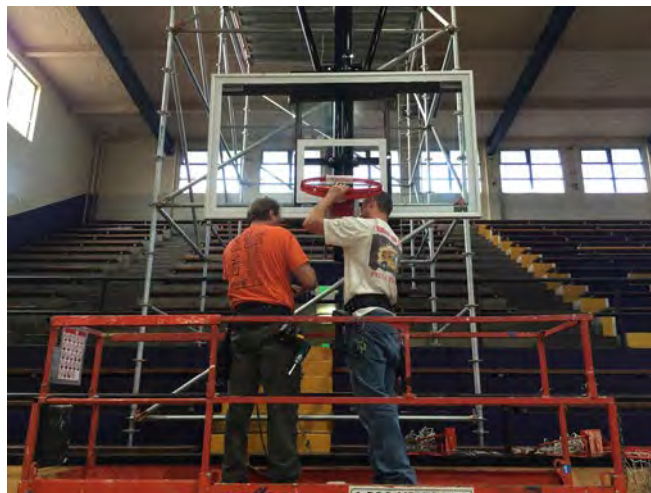

The Andreattas: Four Generations at Riordan

Secret trips to Beep's Burgers. Learning through teambuilding. Brotherhood and unity. There are many common themes that have linked Riordan fathers and sons through the years.

For the Andreatta family, the Crusader legacy is front and center. They are believed to be the only family that spans four generations at Riordan—Bruno '41 (St. James), son Don '68, grandson Don '87, and great-grandson Anthony '19. The family gathered at Riordan in September to share their inter-generational connection to the school and to each other, and to provide an account of what has and has not changed. The short answer: not much and everything.

Bruno entered the Marianist St. James High School at 23rd and Fair Oaks streets in San Francisco in 1937. He was a star on the basketball team where he said "they maybe won a championship or two, but really we had fun," travelling to games as far as Santa Rosa. He went home for lunch, which many students did if they lived in the neighborhood. Virtually all of his teachers were Marianist brothers and priests. In those days, few families had a car, but by the time his son Don was attending Riordan in 1964, most everyone did.

The 1960's were a time of change and tumult. Don '68 recalled the political and social upheaval of the times, which was felt deeply by the school and students. "The Brothers and other staff members patrolled the perimeter of the school," he said, keeping a watchful eye on escaping students and keeping out questionable characters that roamed the neighborhood. Even as tensions ran high, the school experienced growth. Soccer was just starting to be offered at the school, and he recalled some of the outstanding athletes of his time such as track and field star Jim Tracy '68.

Though he wishes that he could have participated more in sports, Don '87 remembered his time at Riordan with

great fondness. "Riordan prepares you for the world," he said. He enjoyed classes in math and accounting, and an unsanctioned field trip to Beep's Burgers. Most importantly, he now sees the themes of brotherhood and unity are as strong today as when he was a student at Riordan. "There was no question where [Anthony] would go to school," he said. "It's the tradition."

When applying to Riordan in 1983, Don '87 had an admissions interview with Mr. Ron Rosa. Fast forward to last fall when Anthony was applying to high schools. Don recalled running into former teachers Mrs. Valverde and Mr. Swan when attending Riordan's tour for parents. "It felt like coming home," said Don.

Now it's Anthony freshman year and so far he really likes it. He hopes to play baseball and golf, and has joined the DJ and Robotics clubs, and stage crew. "There are lots of opportunities here to figure out who you are," he said. "It was always a dream to go to Riordan."

Despite gentle teasing from his family that he is responsible for the next generation of Crusaders (with a strict emphasis on the distant future), Anthony is now officially part of the Crusader Club. It was obvious that the family has an even closer bond now that he is a student at Riordan.

For Bruno, the patriarch of the Andreatta family, he is pleased that Anthony is not only a potential golf partner, but also how Riordan continues to be part of the fabric of his family. At the end of the day, he said, "Family is number one."

Civic Leaders and '03 Crusaders: The Riordan Brotherhood in Public Service

Jeff Roy '03 is one of a few alumni who have graduated twice from Riordan. On December 19, 2014, he crossed the Lindland Theatre stage for a second time as part of the San Francisco Fire Academy's 117th class.

Not much was different about Roy's bonus graduation. His family was there to cheer him on, as were his Crusader brothers from several classes. When I called Roy to interview him about this unique occurrence, he filled me in on the details but was adamant to point out more exciting news—several members of his class have also pursued careers with local fire and police departments. Gordon Wong '03 is with the San Francisco Police Department's Central Station; Brendan O'Brien '03 is with the Oakland Police Department*; Rob Kerrigan '03 is with the South San Francisco Police Department, and Mark Gughemetti '03 and Roy are firefighters with Stations 10 and 31, respectively.

With their busy department schedules, it took several weeks to find a time when all five '03-ers could get together. The group convened in May to talk about their days at Riordan, what it is like to serve the city where they grew up, and how the school prepared them to navigate the yin and yang of tradition and change.

"Where did you go to high school?"

Every one of these public servants could recall at one time or another being asked by a department colleague, "Where did you go to high school?" City connections run deep in fire and police departments, with so many members hailing from Riordan, Sacred Heart, St. Ignatius, and Lowell. In a job that can be stressful, it is nice to see a familiar face.

Gughemetti and Roy have seen each other on calls, particularly larger episodes where more resources are needed. The police officers crossed paths in court. Wong and Kerrigan used to work together in South City from 2011-2014. They've also met Crusaders from other years in their respective departments, with some serving as key

mentors. It's a good reminder that relationships are built through face-to-face interactions, and not necessarily screens.

There is a shared sense of experience about the strength it takes to work in these types of jobs. There is also a natural camaraderie among police officers and firefighters that was also felt at Riordan.

Skills for Life

The 2003 cohort shared easily how the brotherhood that they experienced at Riordan—in the student body, through sports, clubs, campus ministry and activities—can be found in their new careers. When you spend four years learning to get along with people from different backgrounds, it is natural to transfer that ability to build community to the workplace.

Most importantly, these men exemplify the skills learned in the classrooms, hallways, and playing fields of Riordan that are essential, but not always referenced in a marketing brochure, for any career. Gughemetti said it best: "Riordan kids look you in the eye and shake your hand."

The group wandered the halls and peeked into classrooms, and shook hands with many current Crusaders. They asked about their former teachers, who were instrumental in modeling creative ways of how to take care of your fellow brothers. The group laughed heartily when they remembered their classroom shenanigans, but shared nothing but respect for their instructors who helped them learn academic and life lessons in spite of their teenage antics. "Riordan teachers taught you keep an open mind," said Wong.

Adaptation and Change

Keeping an open mind is key in an age where change happens constantly, and seems to be felt even more intensely in the Bay Area with reports of skyrocketing rents, families leaving urban areas, and tech-is-best

mindset. Police officers and firefighters must have a good understanding of public policy, economics, geography, and changing demographics to do their jobs effectively. Understanding these nuances are helpful in any civic job, but become essential when charged with protecting the lives of citizens.

At the end of the conversation, there was a clear consensus about their chosen careers—the most rewarding part of the job is serving others, especially in the San Francisco Bay Area. Gughemetti noted the humanity of “helping people at their moment of weakness. It makes their day better.” Kerrigan hopes for more opportunities to get involved with the community.

O'Brien, of the Oakland Police Department, faced his job honestly. “I have a rewarding career, albeit a tough one,” he said, referencing his work in a city with one of the highest crime rates in the nation.

For these Crusaders, and so many other alumni serving as members of the police and fire departments, they have

an excellent foundation in their Riordan education and a head start to a future that requires both grit and extreme kindness. Said Kerrigan, “Riordan forms you into a man early!”

CRUSADERS IN SERVICE AT HOLY CROSS CEMETERY

Last December, members of the Riordan and Marianist communities gathered inside Holy Cross Mausoleum in Colma to celebrate the hundredth anniversary of the death of the school's namesake and the man who first invited the Marianists to San Francisco, Archbishop Patrick William Riordan. Among the Archbishop's numerous notable accomplishments—such as spearheading efforts to rebuild the city after the 1906 earthquake—he acquired the land and opened Holy Cross Cemetery, where he himself would eventually be interred, alongside fellow Archbishops within its grand, marble mausoleum.

Holy Cross has been the final resting place for generations of Bay Area Catholics and will accommodate over two centuries' more. "We are stewards of this land," said John Bermudez, the cemetery's operations manager and Riordan class of 1981. "In everything we undertake, we want to leave the cemetery in better condition than we found it."

Bermudez is joined at Holy Cross by three other Crusader alumni entrusted with preserving the history and future of the cemetery, Brian McGrath '63, Jim Celentano '67, and David Mehrwein '05 (McGrath is now retired). Each

has a unique role at Holy Cross and a unique path that led him there, but the stewardship and service that are the cornerstone of their work today can be traced to their years at 175 Phelan.

"Those hallways, those classrooms, those teachers..."

Jim Celentano is one of Holy Cross's field managers, but that title barely begins to describe his work. Since 1990, he's worked outside, leading crews for the each day's burials, in addition to being the frontline of service for grieving family and friends across the cemetery's 300 rolling acres. Bermudez said, "Jim is a miracle worker when it comes to those families where a member is maybe angry or very angry, as that can be a natural part of the grieving process."

For Celentano, service is simple. If a family is unhappy or sees a problem, he said, "I'm out there looking at it with them, and we'll solve it together. Whether we solve it that day or down the line, the family's already satisfied you took the time. It's that one-on-one communication." At a cemetery where between five and 15 burials occur each day, Jim's genuine empathy and patience serve as practical

tools to keep operations running smoothly.

When he talks about his time at Riordan, it becomes clear the values that drive Celentano to this day were shaped during his years as a Crusader. "Those hallways, those classrooms, those teachers—those were the best years of my life," he said. "The teachers taught us respect. They taught us networking. They taught us all the common sense skills you can't find in a textbook."

For David Mehrwein, a family services counselor at Holy Cross, Riordan's impact on him was much the same. "Without Riordan, I wouldn't be who I am today or where I am today," he said. "I get emotional thinking about it." Ten years removed from his graduation, many of Mehrwein's teachers are still working at the school, and when he talks about them today, he says things like, "I love that guy," (regarding Mike Vezzali), and, "She's a saint" (of Kim Loder).

"That's got to be a beautiful place to work."

Brian McGrath couldn't recall the exact number of people from the Riordan community he met during his 42 years with Catholic Cemeteries. After leaving St. Patrick's Seminary in 1968, he found a temporary job at Holy Cross Colma and

never left. Having recently retired as Superintendent of Mt. Olivet Cemetery in San Rafael, he was grateful for the impact of his career. "It was a wonderful job and felt like a true ministry," he said. "You help people at probably the worst time in their lives."

Mehrwein's path to the cemetery was also one of accidental providence. "I consider it a calling," Mehrwein said of his work. "I don't think anyone grows up thinking, 'I'm going to work at the cemetery,' but in this field you really do get a chance to serve people." After graduating from Riordan, he studied biochemistry at San Francisco State University because he wanted to work in medicine. "I wanted to help people," he said. While taking classes, he worked part-time retail jobs, then at St. Elizabeth's Church answering phones and helping around the parish, which put him in frequent contact with Mission-district funeral home Valente Marini Perata & Company. They hired David, still an undergraduate, to work in their office and assist at wakes and funerals. Upon his graduation, Valente promoted David to funeral counselor, helping families arrange for funerals and guiding them the day of the service.

Mehrwein has been at Holy Cross since February 2015.

His role as family services counselor means he meets with families, learning their needs and educating them about the burial process, all of this often happening soon after a loved one's death. "Grief is a funny thing," he said. "You might think you bury someone and you're done, but it can linger with people. Providing people with this place where they can visit and it's well-kept and maintained, that's all part of helping them."

It was, in part, Holy Cross's beautiful landscaping that attracted Bermudez to working there. In the late 1990s, he left his job in civil construction management and to care for his ailing sister. In that year, he said, "Every time I drove by the cemetery, I thought, 'That's got to be a beautiful place to work. So serene, it's like working in a park!'" When John did return to the workforce, he did so at another of Colma's 17 cemeteries and has been at Holy Cross since 2006. In his role as operations manager, he oversees burial scheduling, maintenance, and upkeep for not only Holy Cross, but all six cemeteries that are part of the San Francisco Archdiocese. "There's a lot that's not seen in a cemetery," he said. "The pipelines, the pumping, the electrical system, I ensure that all that is working so the cemetery is always looking nice for the families."

In these recent drought years, Bermudez has reason to be grateful that Holy Cross Cemetery has its own 800-foot well from which it draws its water, but he and the landscaping staff are still strategic about their water use. Through planting better sod, installing advanced sprinkler heads, and even planting water-saving shade trees, the cemetery has reduced water use by 30 percent.

"We are stewards of the earth," Bermudez repeated. "We have to be mindful of our resources, but we have an obligation to families who visit here."

"Holy Cross is a pillar in our Catholic community," said Mehrwein. "We are stewards for such a rich history that began with Archbishop Riordan."

So many Bay Area families find chapters of their own histories punctuated at Holy Cross. Bermudez, Mehrwein, and Celentano each have loved ones whose final resting place is their place of work. "That was a driving force in me coming here," said Bermudez. "My whole family's here."

It was during a visit to his mother's grave there years ago that Celentano, anxious about his future following a recent layoff, first considered working at the cemetery. He said, "She told me, 'Why don't you put in an application here?'" He did, and has worked there for 25 years.

Holy Cross's ties to the community also mean their jobs put them in contact with people from throughout their own lives. Bermudez said, "You see friends you grew up with, went to school with at Riordan. No one comes in saying, 'I just wanted to see what a cemetery looks like!' Because we've got such a tight community, it hurts sometimes. Working here is a bittersweet experience."

These Crusaders face death daily, but their perspective of mortality is sweetened by the Catholic faith that drives Holy Cross's mission and their own lives. "In the tradition of the Marianists," Mehrwein said, "we say yes to provide for families."

"Holy Cross is perpetual," said Celentano. These Crusaders know they are part of something that began long before them and which will outlast them all, a healthy perspective to keep on life in general.



Theology Instructor Ted DeSaulnier Reflects on the Pope's Visit

To witness three days of the Pope's visit to Washington, DC was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for me. It was a remarkable trip for so many reasons. The attitude of everyone that I came in contact with, from veteran legislators to the people on the street, was one of excitement beginning on day one and building to a crescendo of joyful gratitude and affection on day three for both the words and actions of Pope Francis.

Sitting on the capital grounds, hearing the Pope's remarks before Congress, and seeing his blessing of the crowds assembled on the lawn, I was not only proud of my citizenship but also uniquely challenged as a Catholic by the authenticity of this man for I knew that I was in the physical presence of the successor to St. Peter. When I heard him say to Congress, "Each son or daughter of a given country has a mission, a personal and social responsibility," I heard the call to citizenship. His physical actions, as he walked, hugged, and talked, summoned me to a greater awareness of the power of a personal witness for the poor and marginalized. Even as I stood some 20 feet away from him in his Fiat, dwarfed by Secret Service vehicles, I heard him speaking to me through his actions.

So much of our culture draws us away from dialogue, encounter, joy, and compassion; all these and more were preeminent in those three days, replacing the often-cynical edge of the politics of conflict. It seemed that Washington became a different place.

The long lines, the ever-present security, a 6:00 am arrival to Capitol Hill to clear security for the 10:00 am speech, and following His Holiness around the city on my rented bicycle were all worth it just to be inspired by this man's presence and to stand in the shadow of St. Peter.

The Achieve Program at Riordan

“Not everyone has a Mrs. Bakar; imagine what would happen if they did,” said Dijon Morrisette ’08. He is referring to Barbara Bass Bakar, the founder of Achieve, a program that serves first generation to college and low-income high school students.

“We are so lucky to have the Achieve program at Riordan because it gives us the opportunity to work with so many wonderful students who would not have had the financial means to attend our school,” said Principal Vittorio Anastasio ’84. “The Achieve Program and Barbara’s vision is naturally aligned with the mission of our school—we want to see all of our students graduate ready for success and to give back to society in one way or another.”

Achieve began at Archbishop Riordan High School in 1997 and now works with 78 students at four Bay Area high schools: Riordan, Holy Names in Oakland, Saint Joseph Notre Dame in Alameda, and Mercy San Francisco. Currently there are 24 students in the program who attend Riordan.

Bakar grew up in Florida. She recalled that her family, by no means wealthy, always looked out for the needs of others; her parents often picked up the tab for groceries when they sensed a family was in need. Bakar would go on to lead several successful retail firms, but was always thinking about ways she could foster change. When she first started Achieve, she quickly learned that more support

services were the key to creating opportunities in the long-term.

“For first generation to college and low-income students, it is very important to have a support system in a school setting,” said Oliver Wijayapala ’13, a junior at Middlebury College in Vermont. “Achieve helped create that support system.” The program provides academic support, college counseling, cultural enrichment, internship opportunities, and a chance for students to plant seeds for their future.

According to Alex Rivera ’88, a Riordan alumnus who serves as an on-site program coordinator at Riordan and Saint Joseph, Achieve is so much more than a tuition grant. “At its core Achieve is a leadership program where we strive to create a culture of philanthropy and service in each of our students,” he said.

Community Involvement

Achieve participants are certainly giving back. They must complete 40

hours of community service per year at the Jewish Home. This service experience also encourages them to keep exploring ways they can impact the world.

Wijayapala is a volunteer firefighter with the Middlebury Fire Department and a Student Wellness Leader, in addition to majoring in Theatre with minors in Education Studies and Chinese Language. Dijon Morrisette, a 2012 graduate of USC, credits his Achieve experience at Riordan for helping him develop a career interest that combines finance with helping the public good. Currently Dijon is working as a Vice President for Academy Securities and just passed the Series 7 exam.

Cultural Enrichment

One of the unique aspects of the Achieve program is a focus on cultural enrichment. Students attend cultural events including theater and dance performances. “Achieve encouraged me to explore the visual and perform-

ing arts at Riordan,” said Hector Navarro '14. “It was through art and music, as President of the Art Club and member of the Crusader bands, that I discovered leadership,” Now a sophomore at Santa Clara University, Navarro is taking both his musical and leadership skills to the next level in his role as a trumpet player for SCU’s first-ever mariachi band.

Achieve believes that exposure to the arts is fundamental for leaders to develop a dynamic set of skills, which is also echoed in Riordan’s arts-rich academic curriculum. “Decision makers need to be creative,” said Morrisette. “Be around things and people that help you develop creative ideas.”

Work Experience

While in high school, Achieve students participate in a yearly six-week summer internship. “Achieve prepares students for the real world by setting up internships to gain the experience of what work life is like,” said Kenya Dumetz '14, a sophomore and prospective psychology major at Ohio Wesleyan

University. During his time at Riordan he interned at local toy company Wild Planet, and later at the Exploratorium where he was a high school explainer. Morrisette interned at Merrill Lynch, and Wijayapala at First Republic Bank and Duty Free Shopping at SFO. Following the art theme, Navarro worked at the SF MOMA, where he was “exposed to some of the best art in the world” while learning about the operations of a top-notch museum.

Ready for College

Parents, Achieve and the partner schools are equal parts in the equation for student success. “We have a team approach in supporting the program, starting with the admissions process and helping Achieve identify prospective students for the program,” said Principal Anastasio. English instructor Diana Assereto serves as the school liaison to Achieve and works closely with Rivera, students, families and other Riordan faculty and staff members to facilitate communication across the board.

“I feel honored to work with such an amazing, well-structured program that offers tremendous academic and personal support while teaching accountability and stewardship,” said Assereto. “Riordan is fortunate to have these dedicated students and to work with a program like Achieve.”

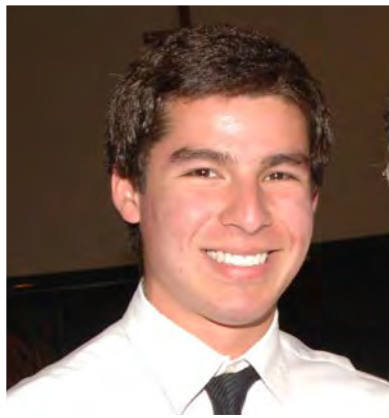
Upon graduation from high school, 100% of Achieve students matriculate to college and 85% attend out-of state institutions. “At the end of four years, Achieve students are ready for the next phase of their education, and whatever else comes their way,” said Achieve program coordinator Rivera.

In the Achieve Program, students find mentors, cheerleaders, and a second family, but also an understanding of the meaning of service and the structures in place to serve now and in the future. Dumetz summed it up: “Achieve wants you to explore the world and give back.” From the reports on these students, they very much do.

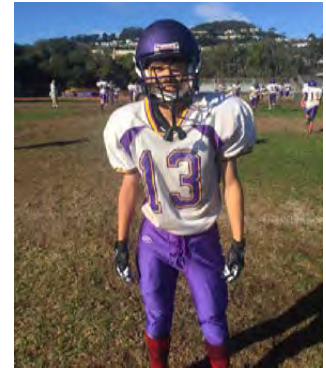
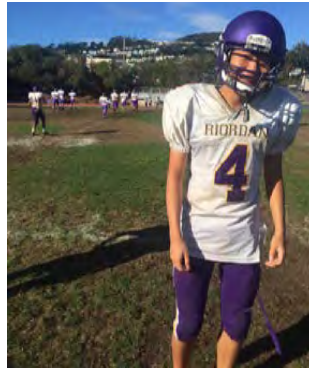

iPad Repair Club Helps Students Learn Tech Fixes *by Alex Vallecillo '18*

There is a new club on campus, and for students who are not interested in joining, chances are they might be in need of the Club's services at one point during their years at Riordan.

The iPad Repair Club teaches students how to repair damaged iPads, whether they have a cracked screen or a cracked LCD. Riordan students can get their iPad fixed for \$100 - \$120.

The students watch a video tutorial, which is one to two hours long, and this teaches them how to repair the iPad. Further questions are answered by club moderator and Technology Help Desk Manager and Boarding Resident Advisor Richard Huling, who is there to assist them.

Huling has repaired iPads and has now taught the students how to do it. The iPad Repair Club went through a test run last year with EdTech Titans and it proved successful, so it is going to take full effect this year.

"Right now each club member will have a required amount of iPads to fix, and the money made will help pay for the cost of the program," said Huling. "After that, they will have enough experience to do repairs on their own and could possibly create their own business."

Currently, the club consists of around 10 Riordan students and officially opened the week of September 8. Skills learned in this club can be used after high school and could potentially help a student land a job in the field, or help them become an entrepreneur.

Brian Zheng '16, a member of the club, said they repair broken and damaged screens, LCDs, and batteries. They can also repair iPhones.

Zheng, who has helped four students with damaged iPads, said, "It is a great club and the skills I learn I can take it into the real world."

FOOTBALL

It has been a season to remember thus far for the 2015 Archbishop Riordan varsity football team.

The Crusaders, under first-year head coach Kevin Fordon, started the season 6-1 with stunning victories over West Catholic Athletic League rivals Archbishop Mitty, St. Ignatius, and Junipero Serra, and a season-opening triumph over defending Central Coast Section Open Division champion Sacred Heart Prep of Atherton.

The 6-1 start is one of the best beginnings to a season in school history and the Crusaders are currently ranked in the Cal-Hi Sports top 25 for the first time ever.

A 66-45 victory over Junipero Serra at City College of San Francisco on October 10 brought the Baxter Trophy back to Phelan Avenue for the first time since 2007. The annual game against the Padres is played in honor of former Archbishop Riordan and Serra football coach John Baxter.

Through five games, senior running back Raymone Sanders leads the Crusaders with 542 yards rushing and eight touchdowns, while fellow senior running back Jason Greene has six rushing touchdowns of his own. Senior defensive end Rocco Russell is the team leader in tackles with 43.5 and sacks with nine.

CROSS COUNTRY

At press time, the varsity team is currently ranked #1 in CCS Division III overall team standings and has defended the #1 ranking for five straight weeks in a row. This is the

most competitive Riordan Cross Country team since the 1970's.

In September, the varsity finished with 328 points to place 9th among Division III schools from California and the surrounding western states at the Stanford Invitational. The Crusaders finished #1 among WCAL Division III schools



Ian Cranfield, Trevor Paulbitski, and Tycho Meimban.

Valley Christian and SHC, and the team posted its best finish in school history. Brian Kosewic '16 placed 18 out of 223 competitors.

The 2015 season is one of the most competitive years in terms of individual and team performances in WCAL Cross Country history; the WCAL claims top team rankings in all CCS divisions and in the state. At the first WCAL meet of the year on October 1 at Baylands Park, the Riordan team placed fifth. Kosewic, Ian Cranfield '17 and Trevor Paulbitski '18 placed 18th, 26th and 28th, respectively.

At the Crystal Springs Invitational on October 10, the varsity finished in the top 10 out of 58 teams from Northern California in the Open Division Championship Race with Kosewic, Cranfield, and Paulbitski finishing within seconds of each other for 32nd, 39th and 40th place.

The team travelled to Southern California in October to compete in the historic and prestigious national Mt. Sac XC Invitational.

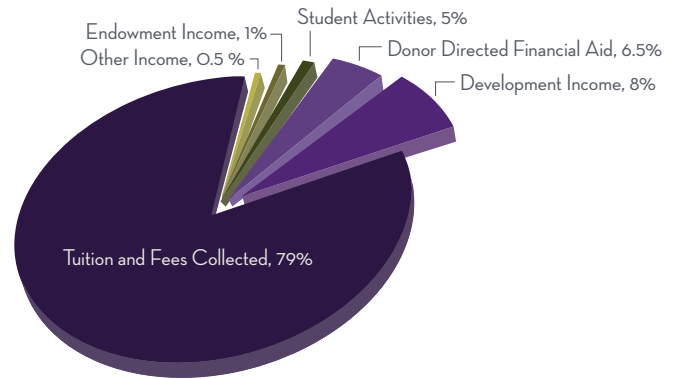

Sources of Income



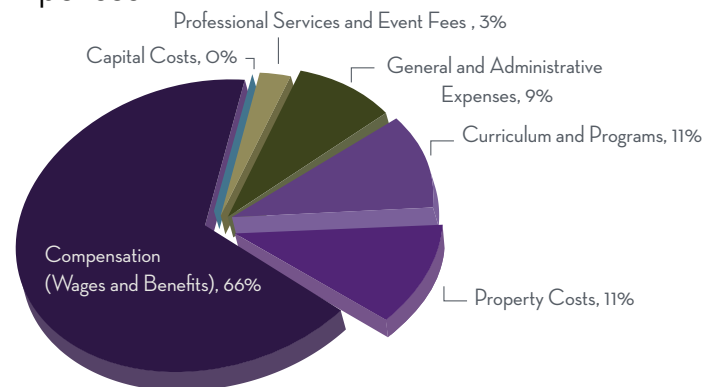

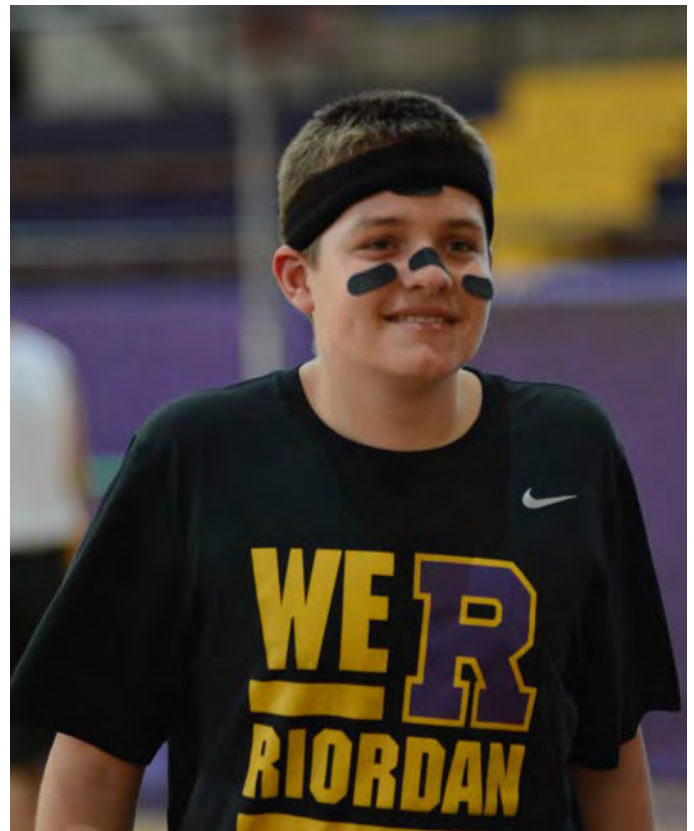

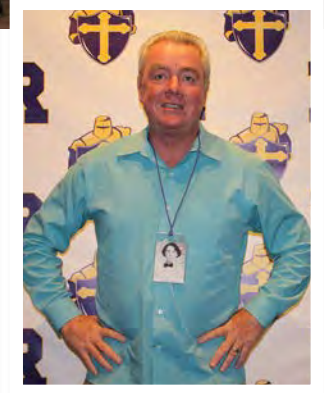

Riordan Prime: First Student Body President Bob Rose '50

On July 4, 1932, with the din and flare of fireworks as a backdrop, Robert Rose entered the world. Because of the Great Depression, 1932 was the year with the lowest recorded birthrate in American history.

The Early Years

The Rose Family had a home in St. Philip's parish in Noe Valley where the pastor was Fr. John Cantillon. Bob attended St. Philip's grammar school for eight years. The school was taught by the Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary or the "BVMs." Early on Bob met Tom McCarthy and the two became life-long friends.

Bob was in third grade when World War II broke out. He helped the Allied cause by growing a victory garden, collecting aluminum, scrap rubber and cooking fat (used to manufacture nitroglycerine). He was awarded The General Eisenhower Victory medal for collecting over a ton of newspapers. For five cents a box he delivered sand throughout his neighborhood to be used to extinguish incendiary bombs. He spent hours searching the sky for enemy planes with the aid of a Captain Midnight plane identification device.

Year-after-year Bob was elected grammar school class president. He served as an altar boy and a traffic boy. He joined the Boy Scouts. He had a route delivering the twice-weekly *Shopping News* to his Noe Valley neighbors. The pay: \$1.00 a round.

Bob honed his athletic skills by constant street play: one foot off the gutter, statue tag, blind man's buff, hide-and-go-seek, stick baseball, handball, capture the flag, kick the can. He became a durable baseball player and a skillful basketball player, and began delivering the morning *Examiner* which developed character since it involved getting up at dawn seven days a week.

Onto St. James

The years at St. Philip's sped by. Along with Tom McCarthy, Ed Douglas and Bill Twomey, Bob enrolled at St. James High School at 23rd and Fair Oaks Streets in the summer of 1946. St. James was an all-boys school with 140 students, a faculty of five including the principal, all of whom were Marianists. Tuition was \$35.00 a semester, payable in install-

ments. Bro. Carl Spooner, SM, a looming figure, was the ad hoc school disciplinarian. The gym also served as an auditorium. Basketball players had to learn to shoot around six large pillars. There was no playground. At noon, Fair Oaks Street would be barricaded for street play.

Through the years at St. James, Bob steadily improved in his studies and at basketball. He beat out Frank Meisenbach to become the tallest player on the team. Coach Ed Delaney made him center. His teammates made him captain (see photo on back page).

St. James, "the old brickpile," closed in June of 1949. The student body and faculty were transferred to the sparkling new Riordan High School on Phelan Ave. Tuition at Riordan was \$50.00 a semester. Before the move an election was held for student body president. The candidates were Joe Azalde, who later became a distinguished Bay Area physician, and Bob Rose, who later became number two man behind Andy Casper in the San Francisco Fire Department. When the votes were counted Bob was elected the first student body president of Riordan.

On closing day at St. James, a fire was started at the corner of 23rd and Fair Oaks. The compulsory St. James High School neckties were taken off for the last time and thrown into the blaze.

Riordan's First Student Body President

As student body president, Bob had a demanding schedule attending Riordan publicity events, introducing students across the City to the newly opened school. Bob and Joe Azalde were honored by an invitation to attend Boys' State in Sacramento. Bob was able to juggle good grades, politics and basketball. Since the Riordan gym was under construction, basketball was played at neighboring San Francisco City College.

Alas, the senior year passed quickly. Towards the end of the year there was a retreat at El Retiro, a senior picnic at Adobe Creek Lodge, and the senior prom at the Gold Room of the Fairmont Hotel. Graduation took place in the Brothers' chapel at Riordan where there was just enough room for the 29 seniors and their families. Bob received a one-year basketball scholarship to University of San Francisco.

Career and Family

The Korean War began June 25, 1950, a week after graduation. Bob finished his scholarship year at USF. The Coast Guard was accepting enlistees. Rather than wait to be drafted Bob, Tom McCarthy and another Riordan classmate, Gene Paridy, joined the Coast Guard. Bob was assigned to a buoy tender which protected the California coast from Communist aggression. After two years of service and having attained the rank of Petty Officer First Class, Bob received an honorable discharge.

Along the way, Bob met his future wife, Marie, a graduate of Ursuline High School in Santa Rosa. The union was blessed with daughters, Pat and Linda plus twins, Richard and Rachel.

The San Francisco Fire Department announced it was looking for a few good men. Bob and Tom McCarthy applied, demonstrated the right stuff, and were hired. Bob studied for every examination, passed every test and in 1980 became Deputy Chief. He was in the middle of every kind of fire. He could often be seen on the nightly news wearing a white helmet and white protective gear directing the fight. He had become a mythical figure. Late one night Bob and his men were the object of sniper fire, but escaped injury. The shooter was never caught.

The fire department had been using a ticker tape and bell system to dispatch crews to fires since 1915. Then Chief Keith Calden gave Bob the task of developing a computerized dispatch system. Other cities were working on the idea, but San Francisco developed the first successful model. This is Bob's legacy to the department.

The gods giveth and the gods taketh away. Marie developed lung cancer and passed away in 1984. Bob showed great inner strength during this sad time in his life. An already good man became more thoughtful.

Renewal

In June of 1985 Bob was sent to Salt Lake City to attend a training conference for a program the federal government was implementing to standardize and computerize the data gathered at fires and other disasters. There he met Hilda, a project manager for the Arizona State Fire Marshall. Bob and Hilda became friends and more and were married

in November of 1985.

Hilda resigned from her job and joined Bob in San Francisco. In February of 1986, Rachel, one of Bob's twins, was diagnosed with cancer and passed away. Two months later, the Deputy Chief, after 31 years on the job, thought it was time to retire. Bob and Hilda moved to Tempe, Arizona.

Continuing a Dedicated Life of Service

In 1997, the City of Tempe started a victims' assistance program entitled, "Care 7." The program operates around the clock providing on-the-spot help to victims of fires, accidents, crimes, natural disasters, and family violence. With service ever in Bob's blood, he joined Care 7. For the past 18 years Bob has been on stand-by and has responded at all times of the day and night with blankets, baskets of food, clothing, shelter, transportation, medical care, and counselling to countless calls for help.

Bob attends Riordan events when he can. He was the star of events surrounding the 50th anniversary of the Class of 1950. He has changed little through the years, still straight and tall, black hair with a hint of gray, an easy smile, a big handshake, and Ronald Reagan handsomeness. To his classmates, he represents the best Riordan has to offer.

50 Years of Profession for Two Alumni Marianist Brothers

When I was a kid, not yet 18 years old, entering the novitiate in Santa Cruz, California, I was unaware of what it meant to be a brother in the Society of Mary. However, I knew there were a number of wonderful members of that Society who taught, mentored and nurtured me through Riordan High School in San Francisco – men who, through their examples and their literal invitations, wanted me to join them in their mission. I was thrilled with the invitations and headed off for what began as a most fortuitous adventure. I was going to be a brother. Many of my friends could not believe my choice: “YOU are going to be a BROTHER! Oh, boy...that’s a long shot,” some of them would say.

“Yeah,” I tell those with whom I am

still in contact, “So far it’s a 50-year shot... and counting!”

My novitiate formation year was tough, but my formative years of study at the Scholasticate in Dayton, Ohio, were enriching. I grew in knowledge about the wonderful heritage of the Society of Mary, and the presence of so many brothers, sisters and lay Marianists from different areas of the country and the world widened my understanding of the global Marianist mission. Upon graduation from the University of Dayton, I was sent to Honolulu to teach at Saint Louis School. Hawai’i was another wonderful cultural experience for me.

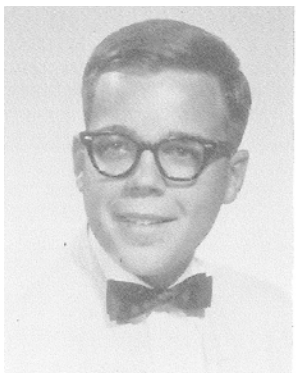
I quickly became enculturated with the island beauty, the people, customs, music and cuisine. I built friendships with families and former students that I still cherish today.

I reluctantly left Honolulu after six years to pursue graduate studies in San Francisco. After completing my graduate degree, I began an 18-year ministry as teacher and drama director at my San Francisco alma mater, Riordan High School. Those years were major highlights of my journey as an educator and theater director, with more than 40 creative, wonderful plays and musicals produced in a partnership with Marianist Bro. James Roberts, a close friend and one of the most talented and creative theater designers with whom I have had the privilege to work.

During these years in San Francisco, I had the creative challenges of working with civic groups as writer and director of the 1976 major pageant commemorating the bicentennial of founding of the city of San Francisco, as well as formulating and working on the team that founded the LIFE (Living in Faith Experiences) retreat program for the schools of the Marianist Province of the Pacific. These leadership experiences helped prepare me when I was appointed as the as-

sistant provincial and director of education for the Pacific Province in 1995.

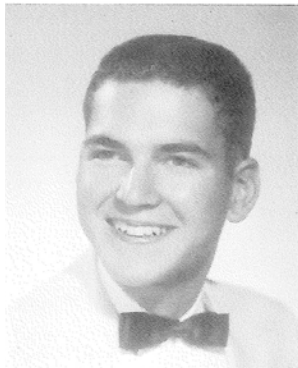

I am grateful for the fraternal support of my religious superiors and the many brothers with whom I have lived and worked. All in all, this has been an amazing, wonderful "long shot."

When I joined the Marianists, people told me I would spend my life teaching high school, and this is what I expected to do. But my future unfolded differently, one step at a time.

I did indeed begin, in 1969, teaching high school only a mile and a half from the campus riots then raging at San Francisco State University. The Bicentennial year, 1976, found me teaching at Chaminade College of Honolulu, where I secured a grant from the state of Hawai'i to mount an exhibit of historic Hawai'i photographs. From that effort I learned how the public expects the Catholic Church to be the custodian of culture. In its eyes, little Chaminade College was somehow the outpost of the Vatican Museum. Thus came a call within a call, which took shape a year later when the provincial administration invited me to organize its archives in preparation for the Pacific Marianist centennials in 1983 (Hawai'i) and 1984 (California).

Obtaining archives certification in 1980 opened the door to archival work in varied settings including religious orders, dioceses, historical societies and the California state parks. The most

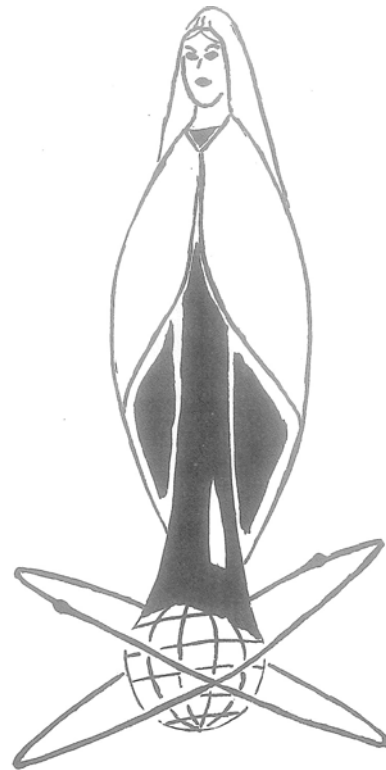


glamorous was arranging the records of the Serra Cause, deposited at the Santa Barbara Mission Archives.

I have worked as an archivist during all of the last 40 years, except for 10 years in the Christian retail book trade. The book trade was another unplanned, unrequested detour. But I learned many things from Christian publishing — not the least being the dramatic progress of reintegration toward unity that has occurred among common Christians since 1965.

In these works I have always been presented as "brother." This made me a representative of "the Church," and by that, everyone understood, the Catholic Church. To my surprise, believers of any denomination felt encouraged that "the Church" recognized their corner of the vineyard.

Only providence can sort through the tangle of events. My hope is that the projects on which I have worked have served its greater purpose.

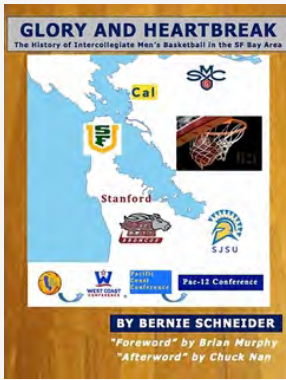

Richard Max '55 Enters San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame

For the second year in a row, the San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame welcomed a Crusader to this illustrious group of athletes. In front of a packed house on May 16, 2015, Richard Max '55, one of Riordan High School's greatest two-way players, became the newest member of the San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame.

Mr. Bob Lee, Lowell High '63 and former Minnesota Vikings quarterback, eloquently introduced Max by describing his unassuming nature and focus on others, rather than himself.

In 1955, Riordan was a member of the Catholic Athletic League, which included Serra, St. Mary's, Marin Catholic and St. Elizabeth's. Max was a three-year starter for the Crusaders where he earned the following awards his senior year: 1st team All Catholic Athletic League, All Catholic Bay Area, All Metro, and 3rd Team All Catholic All American. After graduation he was selected to play in the inaugural East Bay versus West Bay All Star Game at Kezar Stadium. That's quite an impressive resume for a six-foot, 187-pound player.

During his senior year, Max played both ways for Riordan head coach and former 49er, Visco Grgich. Max was a standout center on offense and a stalwart on defense, playing on the line and at linebacker. Max was a true throwback in every sense creating havoc for every opposing team.

After graduating from Riordan, Max crossed Phelan and played for the City College of San Francisco Rams, where he was named All League and the team's Most Valuable Player in 1956. After CCSF, Rich went on to play two years at Cal Poly where they won 17 out of the 19 games during his tenure and earned an Honorable Mention All Coast and 3rd Team Small College All American. The Mustangs were an impressive group that also included former Redskins and Chargers general manager Bobby Beathard, and NFL Hall of Famer John Madden.

Following a stellar college career, Max received interest from the professional ranks. He first signed on with the Los Angeles Rams of the NFL. However, the Rams ended up keeping Les Richter, an All American from UC Berkeley, so

Max headed over to the AFL and Oakland Raiders. Once again, there was another fellow in camp fighting for the same spot named Jim Otto who would go on to have a Hall of Fame career.

Max earned his undergraduate degree in Bio-Science from Cal Poly, and later his teaching credential and a Masters degree. He spent the next 23 years teaching science and coaching tennis and football at Andrew Hill High School in San Jose.

In addition to his induction to the SF Prep Hall of Fame, Rich is also an inaugural member of the Riordan Hall of Fame class of 1976.
